ACTS 16:1-4; 2 TIMOTHY 1:1-5; 3:14-17

Paul was in prison when he wrote a letter to his friend, Timothy. This letter was the last letter Paul wrote to his friend.

Paul loved Timothy and had so many things to share with him. He wanted Timothy to know that he thanked God for Timothy and prayed for him all the time.



Paul told Timothy that he was thankful that Timothy's mother, Eunice, and his grandmother, Lois, had taught him about God and how to have faith in Him. Paul knew that Timothy's faith was real.

Paul encouraged Timothy to continue to learn and believe in Jesus. Paul reminded Timothy that he had learned the Scriptures when he was a child and that he understood how to continue to grow and learn more about God.

Paul explained to Timothy that all of the Scriptures came from God. The Scriptures teach what is right and good. Timothy could use the Scriptures to correct wrong behavior and to show how to obey God.

Paul encouraged Timothy to study the Scriptures because they would help him do all that God wanted him to do.
