Jacob and Esau Reconciled

GENESIS 25:27-34; 27; 32; 33

Esau loved the outdoors. Jacob liked to stay home. One day Esau came back from the field. Jacob was cooking stew.

“Give me some stew,” Esau said. Jacob told Esau he would have to give him his birthright for the stew. Esau agreed so Jacob gave him some stew.

Another time, the twins’ father, Isaac, said to Esau, “Hunt some meat. Make a special meal. I will give you your blessing.” Isaac was old and wanted to give his blessing to Esau.

The twins’ mother heard what Isaac said. She helped Jacob trick his father so Jacob would get the blessing instead of Esau. The mother fixed the meal. She gave Jacob some of Esau’s clothes. The mother put animal skins on Jacob’s arms so his skin felt like Esau as he was hairy.

Jacob tricked his father and got his father’s blessing that should have been for Esau. Esau was very angry! Jacob had to leave before his brother killed him! He went to live with his uncle far away.

After a long time, Jacob wanted to go back home. Before Jacob met Esau, he sent men with gifts to Esau. He sent a message, “I have many animals and servants to give you. I want you to forgive me.”

The men told Jacob, “Esau is coming with 400 men!” Jacob was afraid that his brother was coming to attack him.

Finally, Jacob saw Esau. Esau saw Jacob. Esau ran to Jacob. He hugged Jacob. He threw his arms around him and hugged and kissed him. Jacob was forgiven!
